Re: Your advertisement in Prison Legal News, December 2023

To Whom It May Concern:

In your advertisement you say: "We want to expose..." We appear to have

similar and compatible agendas, but I wish to advance beyond mere exposition.

I wish to inspire and promote corrective action: For knowledge of wrong is of no value absent action to correct same. Consider, if you will, that one might know, perhaps through personal witness, that another had been robbed; that their property had been ransacked; that their person had been ravished. Knowledge of such pernicious acts, however, would be of no value absent the taking of affirmative action to assuage their afflict and to correct the perpetrator of them.

I use this example because this is precisely what the State (i.e., Government) does to countless persons every day; it is known, and even witnessed, by the general public every day. But perhaps because, though exposed, it is not understood, no action is taken to correct it. This possibility then informs us that our goal must be not only to expose the corruption but also to incite understanding of it, and to incite corrective action against it.

You solicit stories, but I wonder in what form you envision such. I would regard the post-conviction habeas arguments advanced by the victims of jurists (and other state actors) to be the best sources of 'believed to be credible' information concerning the maliciousness, malfeasance, and

malpractice (note the order of this list) of such actors. As for stories in this format, I personally have several. And they are telling. My most compelling story (i.e., legal argument) is one of graphic judicial bias. It is an allegation which was denied by the judge which it was advanced against, met by silence from the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals, and by the State Commission on Judicial Conduct (another Talking Head organization) with protectionism. Upon whom is blame to be justly layed, the child or the parent, when a child continually misbehaves but is not exposed to correction? Jurists, such as are the subject of this address, might accurately be analogized as spoiled and protected children, the supervising courts as their parents.
